

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Grace, Peace, and Mercy, be to you in the name of our crucified and risen Lord, Jesus the Christ. Amen

For the next few weeks we will continue our journey with Jesus to the cross where we will once again hear:

"Jesus said, "It is finished." Then he bowed his head and gave up his spirit. " John 19:30

If this were the end of the story, we would not be living as resurrection people. We would be paralyzed at the crossroads, having no clue where to go and what to do. We would not know who we are or where we were going. But, thanks be to God, that is not the end of the story, it is just the beginning. God does something miraculous through Jesus Christ, so we are able to shout with joy-filled hearts on Easter Sunday, "CHRIST IS RISEN!"

"He is not here; for he has been raised." Matthew 28:6

Remember the true meaning of Easter, which is the resurrection. from Congregation Council Meeting held February 5, 2024

Treasurer's Report/Dave Wolinski - we only made budget one week out of four last month. In April, Dan Holtzer, our Financial Secretary, will once again negotiate with our representative from Mission Investment to keep our mortgage payment at \$6,200 a month. Dan has continued to send all documentation to Mission Investment, as requested by them, for a 12-month period that extends to May 2024. During this period, we have continued to pay the principal and interest on the loan. We are still in a deficit situation, but the increase in liquid assets has extended our cash reserves, currently, to approximately 104 weeks out.

We also have gluten free wafers and pre-filled cups of white grape juice for those who request/require them. Those who are not comfortable sharing in Holy Communion in this fashion are still in full Communion through the words of promise.

Both Services are in the Sanctuary with coffee and refreshments available in the CLC before and after each service.
