

++Pastor's Message++ by Pastor Frank Harpster

"Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might be to our God forever and ever! Amen."

Revelation

7:12

My Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Grace, Peace, and Mercy be to you in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. AMEN

Just as Pastor Harry has dubbed October as "Lutheran Month," November is known by many as "Thanksgiving Month." November is set aside (including a national holiday that usually includes lots of food, fellowship, and football) to count our blessings and offer thanksgiving for all that we are blessed with). Even when we are facing challenges, we still have much to be thankful for. The power of thankfulness and gratefulness enables us to navigate life; through our mountain top experiences, our deepest valleys, and everything in between.

I encourage you, through this month (and hopefully as an ongoing practice), to include reflecting on, and offering gratitude and thanksgiving, for all that you are thankful for in your daily devotions. In my personal devotional life, my morning devotions are dedicated to praying for others and the needs that I am aware of. My evening devotions consist of recounting and processing my day, and giving thanks to God for all of the blessings of that day. During difficult challenges, the prayer might be as simple and as profound as "Thank you God for carrying me through that situation" or "Thank you God for getting me through this extremely difficult day." The reality is, it is in the challenges of life that we are able to grow, and sometimes, getting through a particular situation is all that we can ask for at the time.

I have also heard of folks who make a "gratitude list." Each day they add a new thing that they are thankful for. Such practices would be helpful in enabling us to discover the blessings that we may overlook. I think it is human nature to take things for granted and sometimes to forget to acknowledge and offer thanksgiving for the blessings in our lives. Someone once shared with me "I didn't have prime rib and lobster tonight, but my belly is full and I had someone to share my meal with." There is a lot of wisdom in such thankfulness.

As we count our blessings and give thanks to our Lord, who is the giver of everything good in our lives, let us also examine how we are using those gifts, and how we are sharing those blessings for the purposes they are intended: That is loving God and Neighbor. Often times, even the challenges that we face can become a blessing when we share our experiences to love and support someone else who is going through a similar situation.

We are blessed to live in a country where we enjoy so many freedoms that folks in other countries are not able to enjoy. As a white, American male, I also know that there are many freedoms and blessings that I am able to enjoy, that my siblings of other gender identity or color aren't able to enjoy. I believe that counting my blessings, and offering true thanksgiving, requires me to do what I can to advocate for those who are not able to share those same freedoms and blessings. How different would our world, our nation, our communities, and maybe even our own families be, if we all practiced such thanksgiving?

As Christ's disciples we have the assurance that in God's eyes there is no distinction of Jew or Greek, slave or free, rich or poor, and no judgement or distinction in color or gender identity.

We are all beloved, blessed children of God, named and claimed in the waters of baptism. The thanksgiving that we offer for such blessings, is sharing that love, blessing, forgiveness, with ALL of God's children with no distinction, just as our Lord does.

It is my prayer that we can each take some extra time and energy to count our blessings and to be truly thankful for all that we are blessed with. May our Lord empower us to live out our thanksgiving in **Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might** in loving service to our neighbor, no matter who that neighbor is.

Please know that I give thanks to God for you and for our partnership in mission and ministry! May God Bless You, as You ARE a Blessing for Others!

Life at St. Peters

Our worship schedule offers a Contemporary Worship Service at 9:00 a.m. and a Traditional Worship Service at 10:30 a.m. each Sunday. We are offering Holy Communion at both services, handing you the bread and pouring red wine into your cup. We also have gluten free wafers and pre-filled cups of white grape juice for those who request/require them. Those who are not yet comfortable sharing in Holy Communion in this fashion are still in full Communion through the words of promise.

You are encouraged to share the "Peace of God" in whatever way you feel comfortable.

Both Services are in the Sanctuary with Coffee and Pastries available in the CLC before and after each service.

<u>Masks are no longer required for anyone</u>, but you are encouraged to wear a mask if you are more comfortable doing so.

Hand sanitizer – available throughout the building.

Water fountain is available to be used.

We are live streaming the 10:30 Worship Service. This service is then uploaded to our website to be viewed later. The live stream is available through our website and YouTube page.

We are still looking for a couple folks who would be willing to help with live streaming from time to time.

Our November Ministry of the Month is "The Cold Weather Shelter." Each winter we are blessed to be able to convert our Retreat Center into a Code Purple Cold Weather Shelter for our homeless sisters and brothers. This life saving community ministry is only possible through the support of individuals and businesses in

our community.

The Shelter is open December 1-March 30th, based on temperatures and wind chill factors. The shelter not only offers a warm place for folks to sleep in a safe and loving environment, we also provide meals, personal hygiene items, hot showers, laundry service, fellowship, and bus passes for them to get to and from the shelter. We ask you to prayerfully consider giving a monetary donation to help defray the costs of operating the shelter. Please prayerfully consider sending a donation to the church and marking it "Cold Weather Shelter."

We also ask you to prayerfully consider other ways that you might be able to safely support this ministry. First and foremost, praying for those who don't have a warm place to lay their head at night. We are also in need of folks to help with registration, providing meals, and folks to stay overnight with the residents.
